My NCBI Tool to Replace eRA Commons for Bibliography Management: How to Make a Smooth Transition

The *LSUHSC Medical Library* will be offering classes to assist researchers and their delegates to register for “My NCBI” so the transfer of their current items in eRA Commons will be completed in a timely fashion.

Beginning July 23, 2010, program directors and principal investigators must use My NCBI’s “My Bibliography” tool to manage their professional bibliographies. They will no longer be able to enter citations manually into eRA Commons. See NIH notice number NOT-OD-10-103

This policy is to ease investigators’ bibliography management, improve data quality, and ensure compliance with the National Institutes of Health (NIH) public access policy. eRA Commons is now linked to the National Center for Biotechnology Information’s (NCBI’s) personal online tool, “My NCBI.” Using “My Bibliography,” users can maintain and manage a list of all types of their authored works, such as articles, presentations, and books.

As of **October 22, 2010** all citations manually entered into the eRA Commons will be removed from the Commons system. If the items have not been transferred to “My Bibliography” using “MY NCBI,” all data will be lost and instead of the information transferring it will have to be manually entered again.
