## NEW TREASURES OF OUR PAST

The most recent addition to the Medical Library Archives is a collection of materials documenting the history of the Charity Hospital, Confederate Memorial Medical Center, and the Medical School. These files, which were transferred from the Archives at LSUS, contain many treasures of our past, such as photographs, blueprints, ledgers and memorabilia. Included in these interesting materials are Confederate Memorial Medical Center files on the establishment of the Shreveport Polio Center in December 1954, photographs and artifacts from the Medical School groundbreaking ceremony in 1971, and taped interviews with Joe E. Holoubek, Warren Grafton, David DeSha and Reggie Graves. The extensive collection of newspaper clippings includes this landmark announcement from the *Shreveport Journal*, June 2, 1965:
